## Philosophy Course Information Sheet 2022

### Introduction

This document gives an overview of the philosophy course for prospective and enrolling students. It will be supplemented by separate semester plans which will give details of the teaching schedule and assessments for the relevant semester.

### Aims of Course

That students will:

- Understand the nature of philosophy as a discipline and how it relates to other aspects of life and thought.
- Be familiar with representative thinkers in different periods of the western philosophic tradition.
- Be able to interact with the western philosophic tradition as interlocutors in the Christian pursuit of wisdom.
- Be able to interpret and critically engage with the arguments of primary source texts.

### Course content

Semester one will introduce the discipline of philosophy in Christian perspective and engage with the history of philosophy up to the European renaissance. Second semester will continue the historical review through to the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

The class focus will be on a more detailed study of representative philosophers from various periods rather than trying to cover all thinkers.

A Semester Plan will give the detailed teaching schedule and assessments for each semester.

## Teaching method

Classes will be held on Tuesdays, 1000-1200, in college teaching weeks. The classes will include teacher inputs and student activity and involve readings of philosophical texts.

A guiding principle is that education is about students and their learning, not teachers and their teaching. This means that students are expected to be active learners rather than passive recipients of teacher inputs.

## Assessments

Each semester will involve 3,000 words of assessment tasks, including a weekly written reflection and two short papers. Details will be given in the individual Semester Plan documents

Each semester will be graded out of 100% and the marks combined for a whole-course grade.
