### **Aim of Course**

- To show how literature enables engagement with the true, the good and the beautiful
- Introduce students to major works and eras of literature
- Develop the basic skills and vocabulary necessary to read and discuss literature as imaginative expression which seeks to make connections, communicate ideas and explore concepts
- Understand the distinguishing features of literature styles: Epic, Poem, Novel, Tragedy, Play

## **Assessments**

#### Semester 1

- (a) Due on the 21<sup>st</sup> of March: 1200-1500 word essay on the genre Epic. Select one Canto from Dante's Divine Comedy. What universal themes are taught in your selected Epic? How does the Epic genre aid the exploration of these themes?
- (b) Due on the 16<sup>th</sup> of May: Present a 10 minute discussion on a Romantic Era poem. How does your chosen poem communicate a key hope or grief of the Romantic Era? Class will ask questions and discuss after the presentation.
- (c) Due on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of May: Due on the Write a poem (<500 words) to express something Good, True or Beautiful. Read your poem to the class.

### Semester 2

- (a) Due on the 15<sup>th</sup> August: 1200-1500 word essay on character development in Great Expectations. Choose a character in Great Expectations to discuss. How does Charles Dickens employ language and form to develop the character and thereby illuminate aspects of human nature?
- (b) Due throughout the semester: Consider the opening of the reading for this week and facilitate a 15 minute class discussion about the world that the author is introducing the reader to.
- (c) Due on 10<sup>th</sup> October: Write a short literary piece (up to 1000 words) to seek to imaginatively express an idea, reality or an experience, in the style of one of the works studied this semester. The piece could be a short story or a poem.
